#### **PROJECT HISTORY**

- ✓ 1st lighthouse in New York State, one of the oldest active lighthouses in US
- ✓ Lighthouse authorized 2<sup>nd</sup> Congress under President George Washington 1792; Constructed in 1796
- ✓ Final Feasibility Report & Environmental Impact Statement (Oct 2005); Report of Chief of Engineers (Mar 2006)
- ✓ Authorized for construction; Water Resources Development Act of 2007; Public Law 110-114 (Section 1001)
- ✓ Coast Guard transfers ownership to Montauk Historical Society in 1996; National Historic Landmark in 2012
- ✓ 2012 Hurricane Sandy; Public Law 113-2 (Disaster Relief Appropriations Act 2013)
- ✓ Final Reevaluation Report & Env Assessment (Dec 2016, updated Mar 2017); Corps Approved (Apr 2017)
- ✓ Project Partnership Agreement executed with State of New York (sponsor) Jan 2019
- ✓ Montauk Historical Society is local sub-sponsor
- ✓ Project construction cost-sharing is 65% Federal and 35% non-Federal
- ✓ Operation & Maintenance of the constructed project is a 100% non-Federal cost and responsibility






### The existing revetment BEFORE construction (2021)

- ✓ Construction of approximate 1,040 ft. of new stone revetment
- ✓ Delivered and installed new 10+ to 20+ ton armor stones
- Armor, splash, underlayer and bedding stones trucked from NY & CT, with maximum reuse of onsite stones
- ✓ 124,000 tons of stone, including new & reused
- ✓ Top bench elevation +21 ft. NAVD88; Lower Bench +10 ft. NAVD



- ✓ Project Construction started March 2021
- Historic bunker relocated June 2021
- ✓ Stone revetment work completed December 2022
- ✓ Site restoration work completed June 2023
- ✓ Completed Project turned over to Sponsor (NYS) September 2023
