

What does the Mamaroneck and Sheldrake River Basin Flood Risk Management Project entail?

- The Mamaroneck and Sheldrake River Basin Flood Risk Management Project (the Project) is designed to manage risks associated with flooding along the Mamaroneck and Sheldrake Rivers which poses a serious threat to life and property in the Village of Mamaroneck.
- The Project area is situated between Interstate-95 on the west side and Mamaroneck Harbor and the Long Island Sound within the Town and Village of Mamaroneck in Westchester County, New York.
- The project consists of:
 - Channel modification and installation of retaining walls along the Sheldrake River from Fenimore Road to Columbus Park;
 - Channel modification and installation of retaining walls along the Mamaroneck River from Interstate-95 through Station Plaza to Tompkins Avenue;
 - Removal of the Ward Avenue Bridge, the Center Avenue footbridge, and the two footbridges in Columbus Park;
 - Removal and replacement of the Waverly Avenue Bridge;
 - Installation of a culvert underneath the railroad station parking lot
- Non-structural alternatives in the Harbor Heights subdivision
- Provides approximately 4.6 foot reduction at the confluence near Columbus Park; approximately 2.8 foot reduction along the Sheldrake near Fenimore Road and I-95; and 0.4 reduction in the Harbor Heights subdivision.


What is expected to occur next?


