DESCRIPTION: The Inspection of Completed Works (ICW) Program is an Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Program that provides for Corps of Engineers inspections of Flood Control Projects (FCPs) and Beach Erosion Control and Hurricane Protection Projects that have been constructed by the Federal Government. The projects have been turned over to the local public sponsor (city, town or village), which is responsible for O&M. Beach Protection Projects are also overseen by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP). Inspections are conducted jointly by engineers or technical representatives of the New York District and the local public sponsors, noting any observable deficiencies that need to be addressed in order for the project to maintain its structural integrity and design capabilities and provide flood protection to the community.

Within the New York District there are 10 projects in the State of New Jersey in the ICW inventory:

AUTHORIZATION: The projects are authorized under separate and subsequently amended Flood Control Acts for planning, design, construction, and inspection. In addition, local sponsors are responsible for O&M through Local Cooperation Agreements.

STATUS: Flood Control and Snag & Clear projects in the inventory were inspected in 2005, including after the October 2005 flooding events. None of the projects were damaged. Beach Protection projects were inspected in 2006.

PROJECT COST: The annual operating budget for ICW in the State of New Jersey is \$60,000.

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
