Black Point Target Area Site, Oceanville, NJ

DESCRIPTION:

The site was located in the village of Oceanville, Galloway Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey. The Department of the Navy utilized 544.48 acres of Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. The sites was used by the Navy as an aerial practice bombing range under permit with the Department of Interior between 1943 until 1950. In 1950, the Navy terminated its permit with the Department of Interior. The site is part of Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge who is still the current owner of the Former Black Point Target Area site.

AUTHORIZATION/PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The former Black Point Target Area Site is shown on the Galloway Township Tax Map as Block 1301, Lot 1. The Black Point Target Area Site is being investigated under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program for Formerly Used Defense Sites. The Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 authorized that program.

STATUS:.....

Corps has performed the field work for the site investigation of former Black Point Target Area Site. A second Technical Project Planning (TPP) Meeting will be held with interested stakeholders to report the results of our Site Investigation. Upon completion of this second TPP Meeting, a final report will be issued with its findings recommendations.
