Green Creek Bombing Target Site, Middle Township, NJ

FACT SHEET

DESCRIPTION:

The site is located in Middle Township, Cape May County, New Jersey. On 29 May 1944, the Navy obtained a lease over 30.71 acres from Mr. Ralph and Edna Sheets. The site was used by the Navy as bombing target site. On 30 June 1946, the lease was terminated by the Navy and the 30.71 acres fee reverted back to Ralph and Edna Sheets. Sometime in the 1990s the property was sold to the US Wildlife and the area is now a preserve. Currently, the property is being controlled of the NJ Division of Fish and Wildlife, located in Trenton, New Jersey.

AUTHORIZATION/PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The former Green Creek Bombing Target Site is shown on the Middle Township Tax Map (No. 394) as Block 388, Lot 31.01 (a portion thereof). The property is officially designated as 391 Route 47. The Green Creek Bombing Target site is being investigated under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program for Formerly Used Defense Sites. The Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 authorized that program.

STATUS:

Corps has performed a site investigation of former Green Creek Bombing Range site and completed a second Technical Project Planning (TPP) Meeting in September 2007. Based on the results of field work, a remedial investigation has been recommended for this site.
