Ecosystem Restoration Study

FACT SHEET

DESCRIPTION: Crossway Field is a Village of Scarsdale-owned recreational facility and leaf transfer station site. A large New York State-designated wetland is located on the southeastern portion of the site. A Westchester County-sponsored inter-municipal watershed management plan identified the wetland as being in need of restoration. Improvements could include correcting the wetland's hydrology, regrading, removing invasive vegetation, and replanting with wetland and woody plants.

AUTHORIZATION: Section 206, Water Resources Development Act of 1996, as amended [33 U.S.C. 2330].

STATUS: The preparation of a Preliminary Restoration Plan (PRP) was initiated in November 2003. The project is postponed for the rest of FY2004 due to programmatic constraints on Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration (Section 206) projects.
